

10 Great Things this Fortnight

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- 1) On Thursday 8th June all of our student prefects took part in a whole day's training session in preparation for their new roles of leadership within their colleges. Throughout the course of the day they had the opportunity to take part in team building activities led by a specialist company, as well as listening to a range of key note speakers, including an inspirational one hour presentation by our very own Head Teacher, Mr Molloy, about the nature of leadership and success, focusing on how leadership characteristics are forged early in childhood and often are an extension of the various leadership roles that we each take on in our immediate families. Being a carer for a sibling can become a lifelong habit and shows how much we can be trusted by our parents and those we work with. Mr Molly's message was that all of us should embrace the challenges of new leadership opportunities and that we should learn to use these challenges as opportunities to grow and be better at what we do.
- 2) On Tuesday 6th June 2017, Claremont held its mock election. Students were given the opportunity to place their vote for the first time. Year 12 representing the parties worked tirelessly to promote their party and values, during assemblies and the Live Debate which was chaired by Mr Molloy. There was 63% turnout across the school, with students and teachers alike voting. Labour won a landslide victory!
- **3)** Congratulations to year 9 pupil George Freeman on the completion of his 50 hours of service with St John's Ambulance as part of his Cadet First Aid Training. Through this programme he was able to offer active service and demonstrate practical leadership skills. In addition to teaching first aid, he also assisted the service at a range of events, including the London Marathon, the Trooping of the Colour and the Lord Mayor Show, as well as many other local events.
- **4)** On Wednesday 14th June our year 10 Art students completed part of their GCSE practical exam, with 5 hours of intensive work on their projects.
- 5) This week all German and French pupils in year 10 sat a mock speaking exam in the style of the new GCSE. This kind of practice is crucial in preparing pupils for the challenges of the new GCSE and the MFL department were very impressed with the way pupils conducted themselves throughout these exams. We will continue to practise and prepare pupils as we go into year 11.
- **6)** On 8th June 4 pupils from year 9 and 10 had their 'pass out' ceremony with the London Fire Brigade in Wembley following a four day LIFE course. During this time the pupils developed skills of team work and learnt how to cope with a pressurised and stressful environment when responding to a mock rescue mission. The trainers of the course were very impressed with the attitude and commitment of our students throughout the week.
- 7) We are now in the midst of our program of Primary Transition, aimed at ensuring a seamless and enjoyable transition from year 6 becoming our new year 7 cohort from September. Our visits to the primary schools have been productive in getting to know each individual pupil who will start their Claremont journey in September and we now look forward to welcoming them here for the taster days next month.
- 8) Throughout the week commencing 12th June we have had a range of activities and celebrations for book week, including a fantastic performance of Macbeth for all year 7 pupils, library quizzes for years 8 and 9 and our infamous 'Bake a Book' competition for staff and pupils (Congratulations to winner to Ms Savinkina with her 'Potted Mandrake Cakes', inspired by the Harry Potter books. - **9)** On Tuesday 13th June we were fortunate enough to have the acclaimed 'George the Poet' come to school to perform for our year 9 pupils. The students were captivated and inspired by his performance and his poetry.







