Inspectors judge Claremont High as 'outstanding' school

KENTON'S Claremont High School has been praised by education inspectors as an 'outstanding' school.

Ofsted inspectors visited the mixed secondary school in Claremont Avenue, Kenton, in May and were very impressed with what they saw.

The report said: "Claremont High School is outstanding. It delivers an excellent quality of education."

It added: "The rich, vibrant curriculum provides students with a wide range of subjects and qualification pathways that is extremely well-matched to their needs and promotes high attainment."

Leaders were described as having 'a relentless focus on raising attainment' and staff are 'highly committed to the school'.

Headteacher Terry Molloy said: "We are absolutely delighted that our school has been recognised by Ofsted.

"Ours is a true community working together with one over-riding ambition – to support, enable and challenge our students to do the very best they can.

"To have this recognised as outstanding is fantastic and a testament to the dedication and skills of our exceptional team and the support of our governors and families."

Claremont offers the International Baccalaureate for sixth form students, aged 16 to 19, alongside the more traditional A-levels and vocational qualifications.
